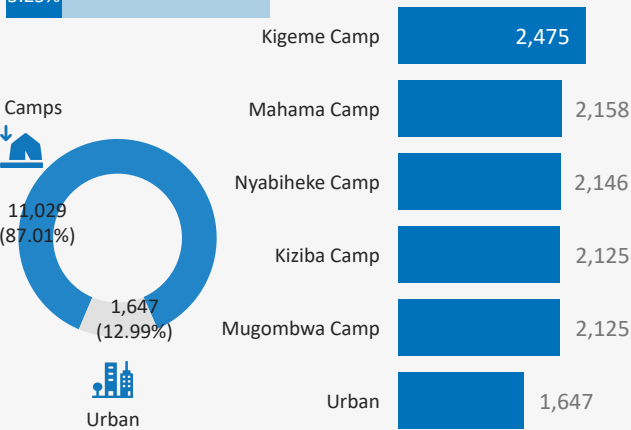
### Age and Gender Breakdown



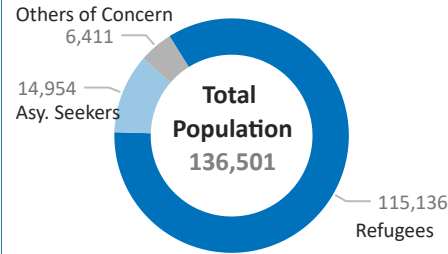

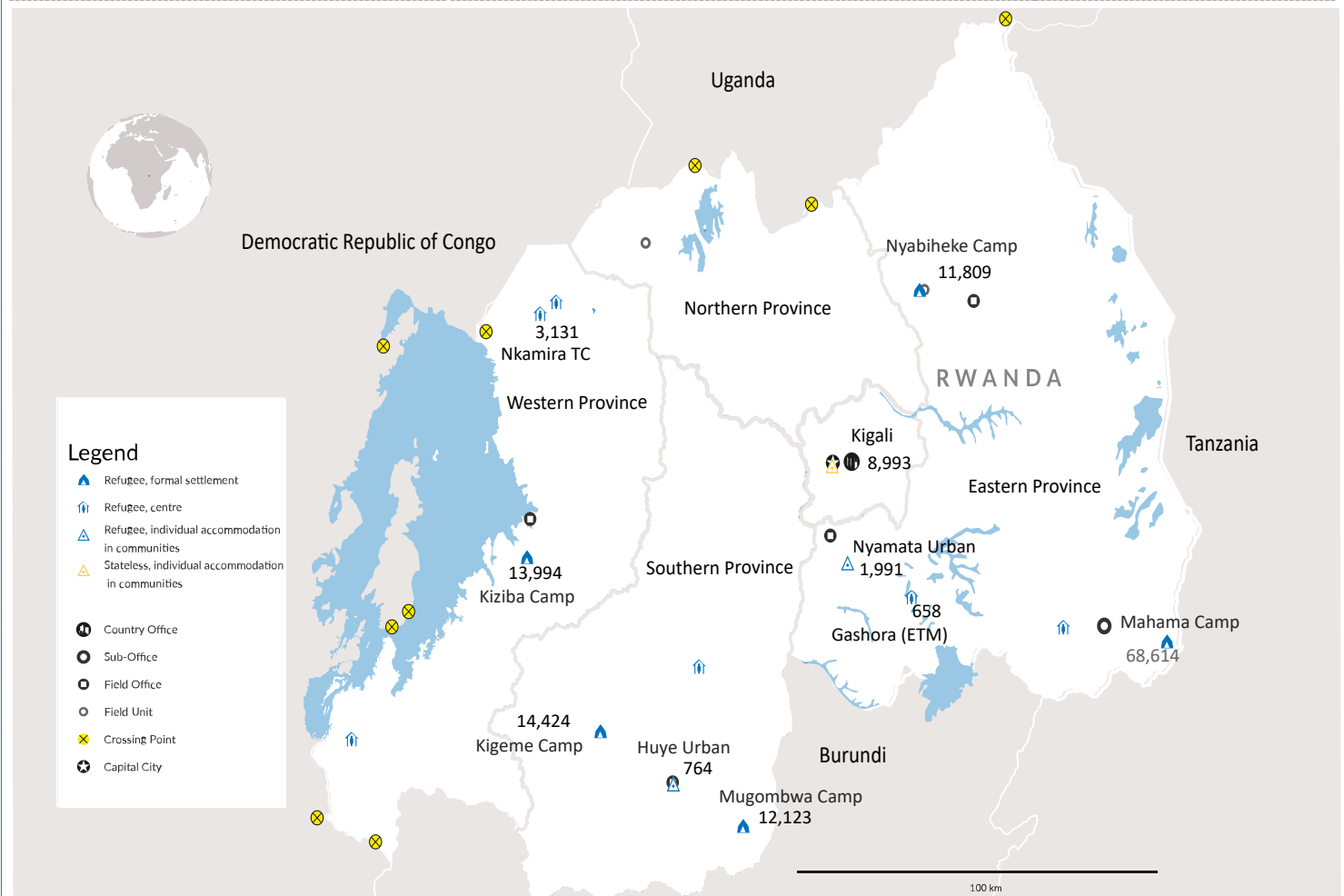

### Overview of RMS in Rwanda

The Results-Monitoring Survey (RMS) was conducted by UNHCR Rwanda for the refugee population. The results Monitoring Survey (RMS) was conducted from April to May 2025, at the household level, targeting refugees and asylum seekers residing in five refugee camps (Kigeme, Kiziba, Mahama, Mugombwa, and Nyabiheke refugee camps) as well as those in urban areas in Kigali, Huye, Nyamata. The RMS survey aimed at collecting and gathering information required to assess the socio-economic conditions, access to services, and overall well-being of the targeted populations, and to provide critical data to inform UNHCR and partners' strategies and policies. Data were collected primarily through standardized questionnaires. The main findings will touch base with different indicators, namely, mobility and registration, disability, energy sources and dwelling, social protection and health access, unemployment and income, safety, and GBV.

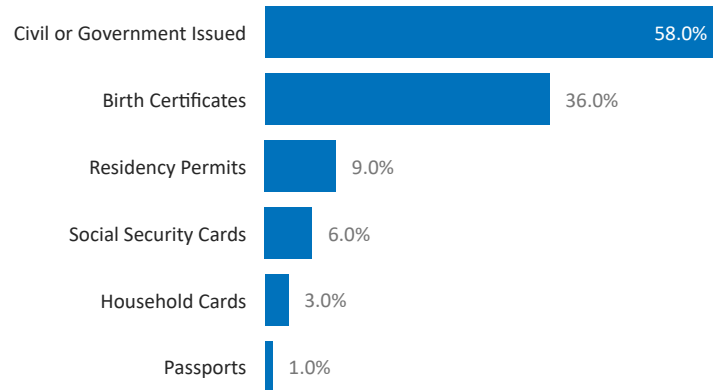

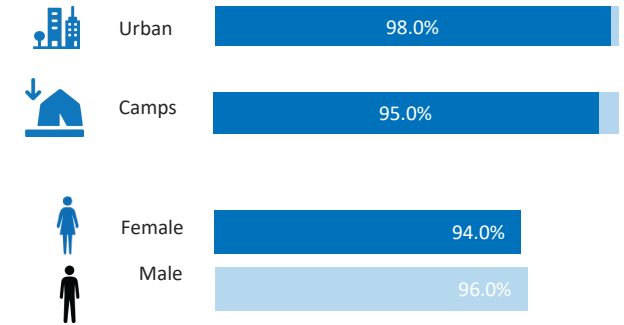

Proportion of refugees possessing officially recognized identity documents. | 2025

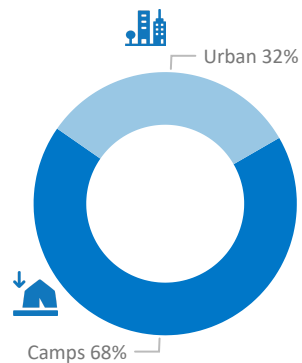

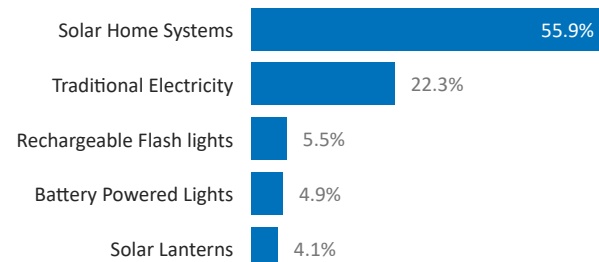

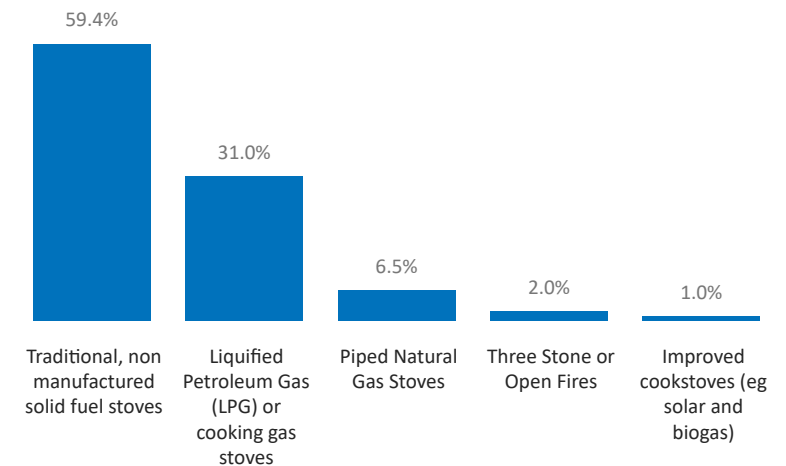

Types of Energy Used for Lighting

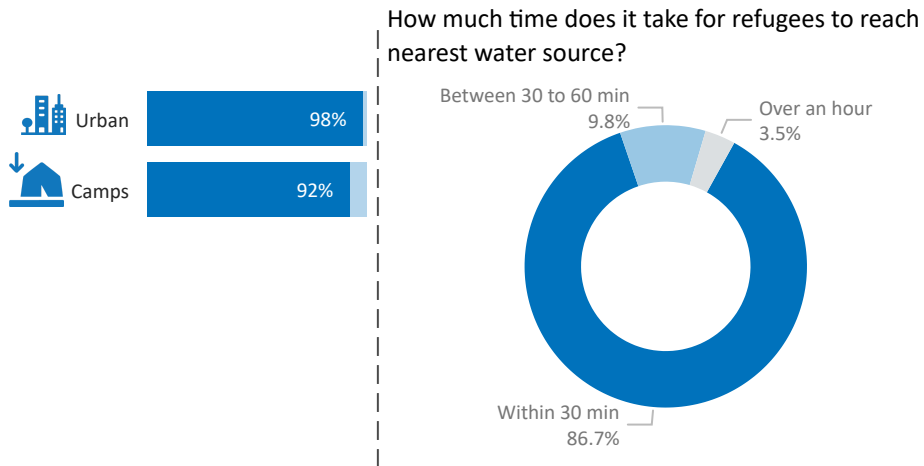

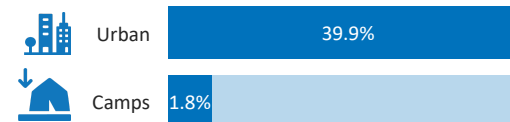

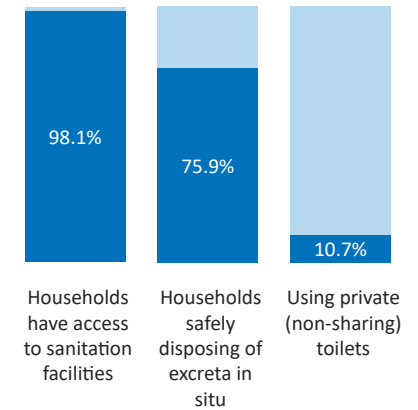

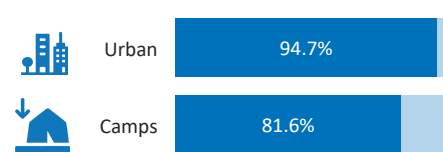

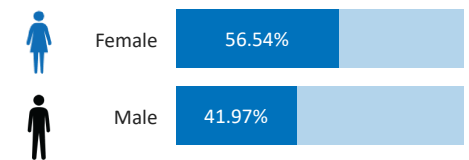

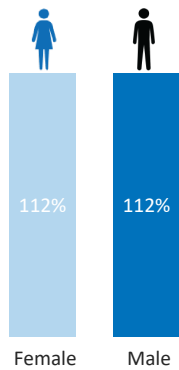

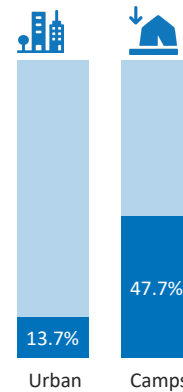

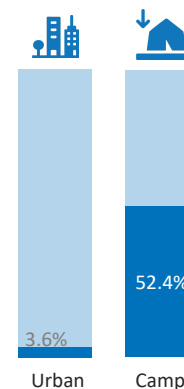

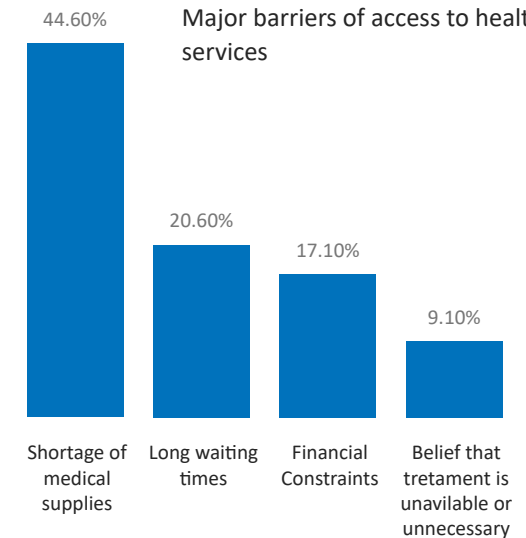
