

Summary of Results

Total number of individuals interviewed: 2053

- 1791 women were interviewed, 1607 of whom answered questions about sanitary pads and underwear
- 215 men were interviewed, 182 of whom answered questions about sanitary pads and underwear. These responses were excluded from the analysis.

Sanitary pads

Number of respondents: 1536

Quantity

- 49% of respondents indicated that the quantity of sanitary pads received was sufficient.
- 48% of respondents indicated that the quantity of sanitary pads received was insufficient.
- There were slight differences between locations, with the majority of respondents in Palabek (83%), Palorinya (67%), Nakivale (67%) and Imvepi (64%) expressing that the quantity of sanitary pads received was insufficient.

Quality

- 81% of respondents reported that the quality of the sanitary pads was either good or very good, 17% acceptable and 2% poor or very poor.

Usefulness

- 75% of respondents said that the items received were very useful, 24% somewhat useful and 1% not useful.

Items sold, exchanged or gifted

- 4% of the respondents admitted that the items had been sold, gifted or exchanged. The vast majority, 96% of respondents, stated that the items had not been sold, gifted or exchanged.

NB: No major differences in the results were found according to nationality or age of the respondents

Underwear

Number of respondents: 1518

Quantity

- 49% of respondents indicated that the quantity of underwear received was sufficient.
- 48% mentioned that the quantity was insufficient. 3% indicated that the quantity was too much.
- There were slight differences between locations, with the majority of respondents in Palabek (83%), Paloriinya (67%), Nakivale (68%) and Imvepi (64%) expressing that the quantity of underwear received was insufficient.

Quality

- 82% of respondents mentioned that the quality of the underwear was good or very good, 16% stated it was acceptable and 2% said the quality was poor or very poor.
- The majority of respondents in most locations reported that the quality of the underwear received was either good or very good. The only exception is Kiryandongo where a slight majority of the respondents reported that the products were of acceptable quality.

Usefulness

- 74% of respondents mentioned that the items received were useful, 25% said they were somewhat useful and 1% said they were not useful.

Items sold, exchanged or gifted

- 5% of respondents stated that the items had been sold, gifted or exchanged. 95% of respondents mentioned that the items had not been sold, gifted or exchanged.

NB: No major differences in the results were found according to nationality or age of the respondents

Soap

Number of respondents: 1737

Quantity

- 49% indicated that the quantity of the soap received was sufficient.
- 48% said the quantity of the soap received was insufficient.
- The majority of respondents in Palabek (83%), Palorinya (67%), Imvepi (66%), Nakivale (62%) and Bidibidi (53%) stated that the quantity was insufficient.

Quality

- 81% of respondents mentioned that the soap distributed was of good or very good quality, 17% said it was acceptable and 2% reported poor or very poor quality.

Usefulness

- 74% of respondents mentioned that the soap received had been useful, 25% said somewhat useful, and 1% reported that the soap had not been useful.

Items sold, exchanged or gifted

- 5% of respondents said the soap had been sold, gifted or exchanged. 95% of respondents indicated that the items had not been sold, gifted or exchanged.

NB: No major differences in the results were found according to nationality or age of the respondents
