Overview

ABSTRACT

The National Demographic and Health Survey conducted in 2015 was conducted in a subsample of the national Survey of Households for Health Studies of the Health and Social Protection Ministry of Colombia. This subsample takes 51,983 households, proportionally distributed among urban and rural areas of 295 municipalities across the country.

The main objective of the ENDS is to study the demographic changes of the Colombian population that have occurred in the previous 5 years, and to obtain information on knowledge, attitudes and practices in sexual and reproductive health of men and women in reproductive age.

Specficially, it aims to:

- identify changes in the population structure
- estimate socioeconomic characteristics of the Colombian population
- estimate internal and international migration, reasons for migration and displacement (IDP)
- estimate sociodemographic characteristics of men and women in fertile age with emphasis in educational access and health access.
- estimate levels of child mortality
- determine use of services of prebirth health and child health
- determine levels of knowledge regarding mammary self examination, mammograms, prostate examination and testicular self-examination.
- measure knowledge, attitudes and practices related to sexually transmitted infections and HIV/AIDS
- estimate levels of psychological violence against women and men and tolerance level to gender violence

Sampling

Sampling Procedure

This is a probabilistic, clustered, stratified and multi-staged sample which used the Master Household Sample for Health Studies developed by Ministry of Health and Social Protection as a sampling frame. The universe of the ENDS is all civilian, non institutionalized population between 13 and 69 years old, in urban and rural areas of 1122 municipalities in 32 regions of Colombia and the Bogota DC.

Effectively, the sample was drawn from 92799 eligible identified persons for the individual sample, coming from 44614 households from different socioeconomic strata, concentrated in 295 municipalities. These were clustered in 258 PSU of the country's 32 regions and Bogota. Effectively, the sample worked 4878 segments, of which 74% were urban and 26% rural.

Response Rate

In households, the response rate reached 86.6%, with a minimum of 74.6% in Bogota and a maximum of 90.1% in Orinoquia and Amazonia.
