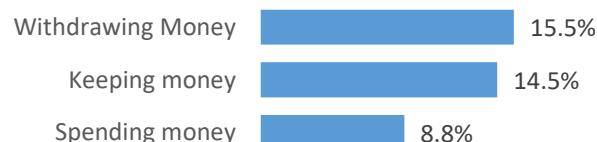

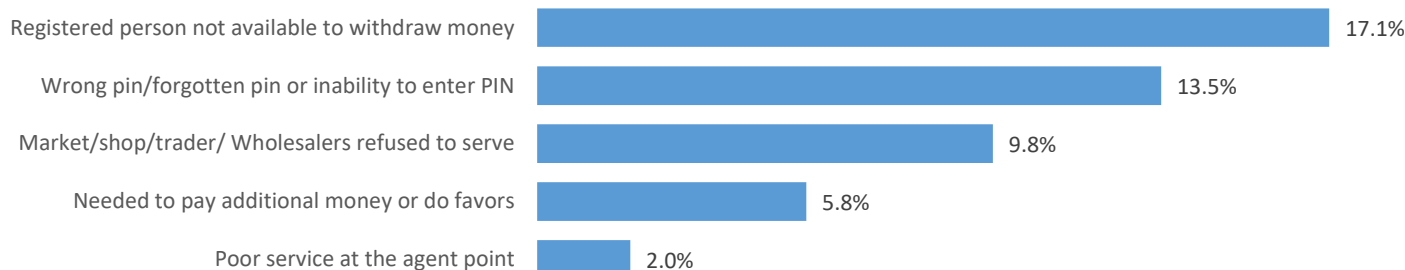

Percentage of households feeling at risk



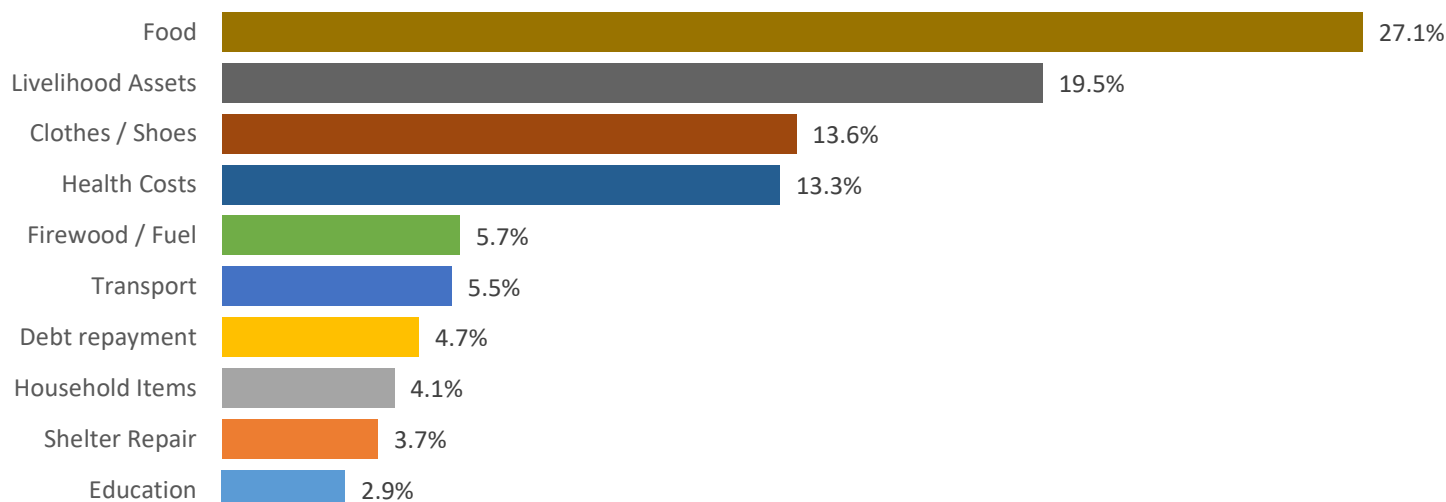
Percentage of household facing problems

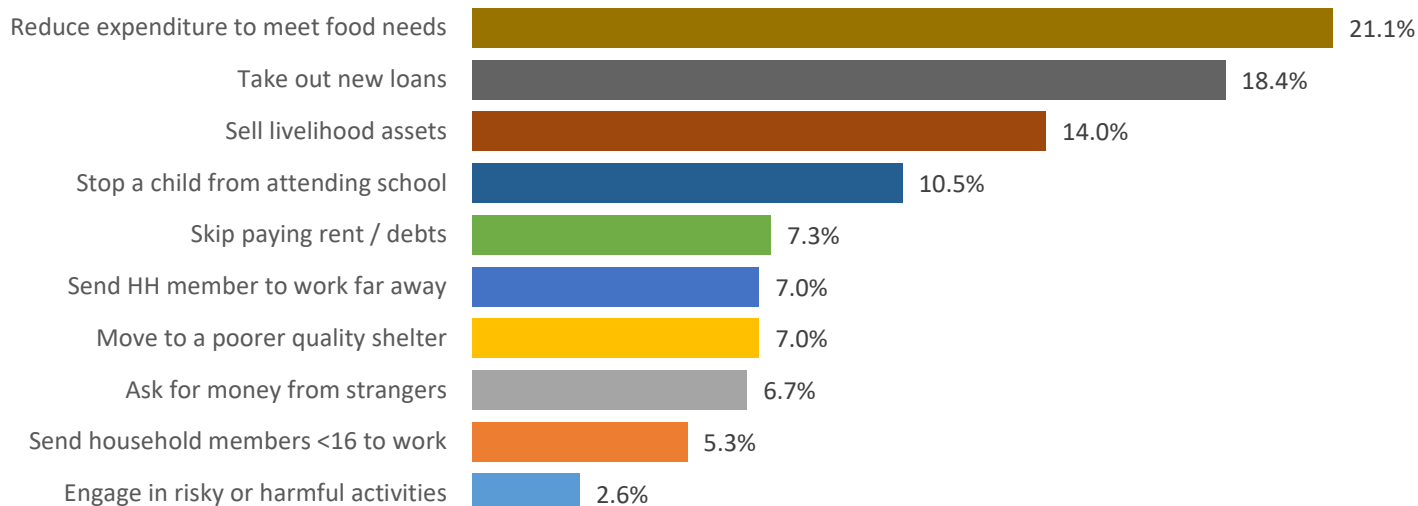


Wellbeing and use of coping mechanisms

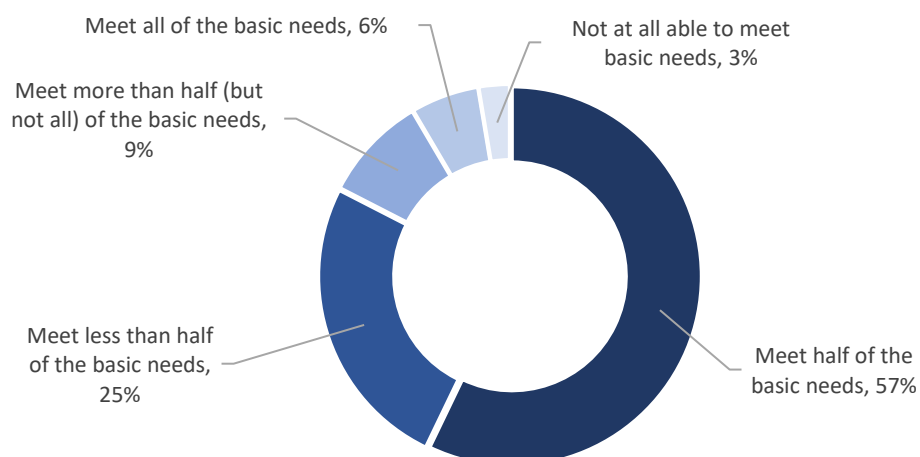
